It may be hard for you to feel optimistic about the future right now. If you've lost a spouse, child, family member or friend, you've probably found there are not many people who understand the deep hurt you feel. This can be a confusing time when you feel isolated and have many questions about things you've never faced before. GriefShare groups meet weekly to help you face these challenges and move toward rebuilding your life. Each GriefShare session has three distinct elements:

VIDEO SEMINAR WITH EXPERTS

Each week, your GriefShare group will watch a video seminar featuring top experts on grief and recovery subjects. The people on the videos are those with real-life stories who have experienced losses like yours. This 13-week session covers the following topics and each session is "self-contained" so that you don't have to attend every session. Pastor Paul will attend our last session topic so that he can answer any questions that you may have about what the Bible says about Heaven.

SUPPORT GROUP DISCUSSION WITH FOCUS

After viewing the video, you and the other group members will spend time as a support group, discussing what was presented in that week's video seminar and what is going on in your lives.

WORKBOOK-BASED PERSONAL STUDY AND REFLECTION

During the week, you will have the opportunity to use your workbook for further personal study of the grieving process and to help sort out your emotions through journaling. Your group will spend time discussing questions and comments from the workbook study.

GriefShare is for people grieving the death of a loved one. Many other life situations bring deep grief, such as separation and divorce, a loved one who is dying, loss of a job, etc. GriefShare is not designed to meet the needs in these types of situations.

Opportunities To Be His Light

Dennehotso Clothing Drive

The bins for donations of new or gently-used clothing will be out the **third weekend** of each month as we again begin collecting warm clothes for the native people of Dennehotso. Last fall we had a very successful drive with over 100 boxes of clothing being delivered to Dennehotso. Rather than distribute the clothing at the church we are partnering with, we went to the Chapter House and had a much bigger turn-out. We learned that the adults are really in need of jeans, closed-toed shoes, winter coats and blankets. The adults, especially the women really don't have a need for dress clothes (pants, dresses, dressy blouses etc.) The kids can use any kind of clothing. Since the next trip to deliver clothing will be fall/winter 2012, summer clothes are not needed. Dennehotso Mission Trips – 2012

This year will be the fourth year that Family in Christ has partnered with Dennehotso Bible Church to reach out to the Navajo people living in the Four Corners region. God has blessed our continued relationship by first breaking down walls of distrust between us and the Navajo church members; true friendships have been built. More recently, He has opened up pathways of influence into the community so that we can reach out beyond the church into the lives of hurting people.

Every time we go, we notice the brightness of the stars at night – far more brilliant than anything we can see here. The reason, of course, is that Dennehotso is in the middle of the darkest area of the U.S. Every time we go, we are reminded that the people are also in great darkness. But God has many lights in the community, and He has called us to strengthen the ones that are there and to take His light to emblazon many others.

This June, we plan to repeat our annual trips to Dennehotso and are looking for volunteers to go. *Please pray about your involvement.* Talk to others who have participated. Take note of the payment deadlines; we will hold three team building/planning meetings in the 6 weeks leading up to each trip.

Construction Trip: June 3-8

The church building has one wall crumbling with dry rot. The main project this year is to seal the window sill causing the problem and replace the sheet rock. A manpower allows: replace tile in kitchen area, painting, electrical rewiring.

Who can go? Any adult willing to swing a hammer, use a paint brush, or cook and clean. If you have a specialized skill in any of the following areas, you are particularly needed: sheet rock/texturing, laying tile, electrician.

Cost: \$125/person *Payment Deadline:* April 22

Accommodations for either trip: Sleeping, eating, bathing at the church facility. If you wish to stay in a hotel, you are responsible for the additional cost and travel to and from the church (half hour one way.)

If these dates don't work for you, you can still show support for the church in Dennehotso. We need funds to buy construction materials and children's Bibles. Or if you cannot take the time off but could sponsor someone else to go, there are always people with the heart and time to go but not the means. You could sponsor such a person.

Ministry Trip: June 9-16

During the day, the team will work through the local Chapter House to serve meals to the community's elderly. In the evenings, the team will conduct Vacation Bible School for the elementary children and Sports Camp for the middle school and teens.

Who can go? Anyone from Middle School (6th grade) and up. (Parent/guardian must accompany their youth and be responsible for them at all times.) For VBS, we need people to lead games, crafts, singing. For Sports Camp, we need people who love middle school age teens and can lead active games/sports. For Adult ministry, we need people willing to cook, clean, serve, and listen.

The WoRM is offered at 9:00 and 10:30 Sunday mornings. This Workshop Rotation Model is a kid-friendly way to teach Bible stories and faith principles. 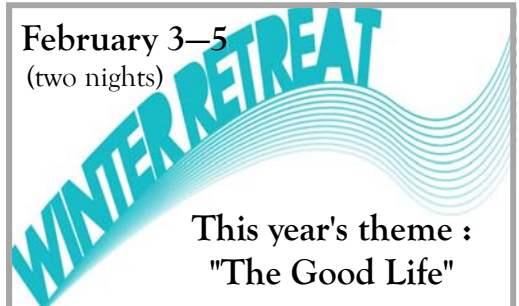

Update from Susan & Brian Frey

We wish to thank you for your encouragement, prayers and support. We continually thank God for sending us such a great team of people to stand with us! Here is a brief update from each of us on what we have been doing the last few months:

Susan:

I am constantly reminded of how big the Bible translation task in Papua New Guinea is. There are over 800 languages, including an estimated 300 that are still in need of Bible translations. There is a constant shortage of personnel too, which further complicates the task. In the last year and a half, since I became a mom, it has been a bit of a struggle to figure out how to balance my desire to be involved in language work and the demands of taking care of the home and a baby. I've had a number of different part-time jobs over the past year as I try to figure this out.



I'm very excited about the most recent project that I have taken on. In December, I did some Scripture audio recording with the Kanite language. This is the start of what will hopefully become a bigger project. In the Highlands region of Papua New Guinea, there are 45 languages that have published New Testaments. Since our mission's base is situated in the Highlands, many of these New Testaments were among the first translated. This project aims to record a small portion of the Scriptures in each of these languages and to distribute them on solar-powered MP3 players or memory cards that can be used in cell phones. By distributing the audio recordings, we are hoping for one or more of the following results:

- People will be encouraged to buy and use the Scriptures that have already been published
- To possibly raise interest in doing an audio recording of the entire New Testament
- To check the quality of the translation— is it clear and understandable, or is a revision needed?

Prayer:

The end of our our-year field term is in sight. We plan to return to the U.S, in early August for a one-year home assignment. Pray that planning to return home will not draw our attention away from the work here. We want to be able to stay focused on our work in Papua New Guinea over the next several months with confidence that God will provide for all of the needs that we will have as we return home for a time. (We plan to share more about our home assignment plans and needs in a future newsletter.)

Brian:

This past year has been full of change in my job. As we shared previously, my department (Industrial) has changed to become a part of the new Construction and Maintenance Department (CAM). This has occurred by combining the Industrial and Construction Departments to better distribute the workload of our team and to work more productively. The current phase of the project is the remodel of our office building to accommodate the combined office staff. Hopefully the remodel will

be near completion by the end of January. Because I am the resident heavy diesel/equipment mechanic I get asked a variety of questions on machines and vehicles that we maintain around the country. In February the Pacific Orientation Course in Madang (where new arrivals receive their initial language and culture training) will receive a John Deere backhoe that was purchased used in the US. When it arrives, I will make a trip to Lae (the port city) to unload it out of the container, reassemble it, and load it on a truck for its trip to Madang. It will then be put to work rebuilding and maintaining the mountain road that goes up to the POC facility. This is a much needed machine that POC has been praying about for many years and they are excited to finally be receiving it.
